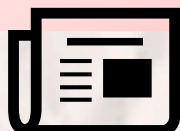


RESSOURCES TO ORGANISE AGAINST THE FR-UK BORDER...

Info and calls for support are regularly posted on the collaborative sites of the Indymedia (lille.indymedia.org in Lille, etc.) and Mutu (paris-luttes.info in Paris, stuut.info in Brussels, etc.) networks, as well as on the Demosphere activist agendas of nearby towns (dunkerque.demosphere.net in Dunkirk, lille.demosphere.net in Lille, etc.).

alarmphone.org : website of the AlarmPhone network, which monitors the situation of boatpeople crossings and the practices of the coastguards in different areas, and has 24/7 hotline for boatpeople in distress.

captainsupport.net : website of the group “Captain Support”, which supports people criminalized for facilitating freedom of movement, including smallboat captains in the Channel.

TOOLS



A “**new arrival guide**” available in many languages is updated every month by associations to list useful services and places in the area:

→ For **Calais**: lc.cx/calais

→ For **Dunkirk/Grande-Synthe**: lc.cx/grande-synthe

These links also contain **risk reduction info when crossing** the border (by boat and by lorry) and **legal advice** for new arrivals in the UK.

Many **associations and collectives supporting migrants** are active at the border. The “Plateforme des Soutiens aux Migrant·e·s” (PSM) lists them on its website and has many other useful tools for people in solidarity: psmigrants.org

The **Tarjimly translation app** (available only on smartphones) is free and puts you in direct contact with translators in many languages.

The **Windy weather app** (also available on windy.com) provides accurate weather forecasts, including wave height and wind speed. Tutos on how to use Windy are available on the AlarmPhone website.

A **collaborative map of surveillance cameras** (everyone can update the map, there is a user tuto) is available at this link: u.osmfr.org/m/929875

SOME PUBLIC APPOINTMENTS



Action Thursdays are weekly meetings for reflection and organization of collective actions, open to all, every Thursday at 6:30pm at the Maison d'Entraide et de Ressources, 3 rue de Croy (62100 Calais).

The **Dunkirk anti-CRA collective** is struggling against the project to build a prison for foreigners in the region and meets on the first Tuesday of each month at the grocery store La Source, 7 Rue de l'Abbé Choquet (59140 Dunkirk). More info: dunkerqueantica@autistici.org

The **Calais No-Border Infokiosk** is a project for meeting, sharing info, discussing and organizing against borders. It is sometimes at the Secours Catholique day center (47 rue de Moscou, 62100 Calais) on Monday, Wednesday and Friday afternoons, and can also be mobile.

To fight indifference, each time a death is announced, a **gathering to commemorate the deaths at the border** takes place the next day at 6:30pm at Parc Richelieu in Calais.

A **gathering in support with Palestine** takes place every Saturday at 6pm on the Place d'Armes in Calais, and will continue until the ceasefire!
